1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting that his naval record be corrected by removing the fitness report for 9 July to 31 October 1988, a copy of which is at Tab A to enclosure (1). Enclosure (2) shows the Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC) Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) has directed removal of this fitness report. Petitioner further requested removing his failure of selection by the Fiscal Year (FY) 2000 Lieutenant Colonel Selection Board, so as to be considered by the selection board to convene on 19 October 1999 to consider officers of his category for promotion to lieutenant colonel as an officer who has not failed of selection to that grade. Finally, he requested a special selection board.

2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Brezna, Mazza, and Silberman, began their review of Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 29 September 1999, and completed deliberations on 30 September 1999. Pursuant to its regulations, they determined that the limited corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (3), the HQMC office having cognizance over the subject matter of Petitioner's request to strike his failure of selection for promotion has commented to the effect that this request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (3), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting limited relief, specifically, removal of Petitioner's failure of selection for promotion.

The Board finds that Petitioner's request for a special selection board should be denied. In this regard, they note that his regular board is imminent. Further, they feel his consideration by the regular board, with a corrected record and in the status of an officer who has not previously failed, will provide him adequate relief.

In view of the above, the following limited corrective action is recommended.

RECOMMENDATION:

a. That Petitioner's record be corrected so that he will be considered by the earliest possible selection board convened to consider officers of his category for promotion to lieutenant colonel as an officer who has not failed of selection for promotion to that grade.


b. That any material or entries inconsistent with or relating to the Board's recommendation be corrected, removed or completely expunged from Petitioner's record and that no such entries or material be added to the record in the future.

c. That any material directed to be removed from Petitioner's naval record be returned to the Board, together with a copy of this Report of Proceedings, for retention in a confidential file maintained for such purpose, with no cross reference being made a part of Petitioner's naval record.

d. That Petitioner's request for a special selection board be denied.

4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c)) it is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
